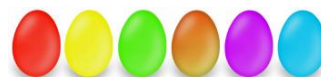

This is the great Easter competition open to all Primary school-aged children and under. You can win a chocolate Easter egg. The closing date for all entries:

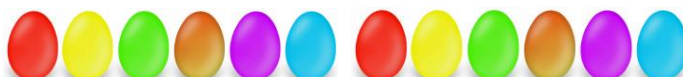

Life Story

Read the introduction of this fit 97 year old lady who served in the NAAFI (Navy Army & Air Force Institute) during the Second World War.



Laura who is a Whiteinch resident was conscripted (called up) at the age of 18. Laura left behind her accountancy course and French lessons to go and serve her country in the time of war.

After her initial training in Dalkeith, Perthshire she travelled during the blackout by train, all the while wondering where this journey was going to take her.

Laura found herself in familiar surroundings much nearer to home than she had anticipated, leaving the train at Greenock.

The next part of her journey took her to sea; anchored in Greenock harbour was a ship ready to take Laura and

her fellow NAAFI conscripts on the long journey to Algiers, North Africa. Her adventure was only just starting.

Currently there are still places on this course.

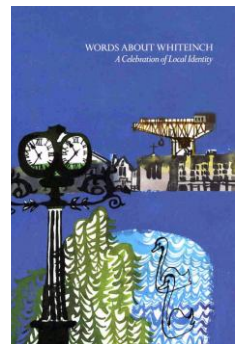
There is a cost associated with this course, but it does depend on the numbers. Contact reception to book a place on the course
